Research Associate/Assistant in Psychology and Education: University of Manchester. This role offers the opportunity to work on an ESRC funded project to adapt and evaluate a parent-delivered early language intervention (Parents and Children Together; PACT https://sites.manchester.ac.uk/pct/) for young children with Down syndrome. This project involves: 1) A pilot study with a small group of parents and children to explore adaptations to the existing PACT programme; 2) A feasibility randomised controlled trial (RCT).



<u>Down Syndrome Toolkit for</u> <u>Paediatric Speech & Language</u> <u>Therapists</u>



Lancashire & South Cumbria NHS Trust have created a toolkit which aims to provide evidence-based guidance to speech and language therapists working with children with Down syndrome from birth to 19 years of age. It includes an overview of the relevant literature on how Down syndrome influences speech and language development, provides guidance on therapy approaches and practical tools for assessment and target setting.
