Retrieval Practice Study

Dr Kelly Burgoyne, Dr Laura Boundy and Emily Croft have found that children with Down syndrome benefit from retrieving (producing) words during learning as children were able to more accurately recall words in a retrieval learning condition compared to restudy. For more information visit:
